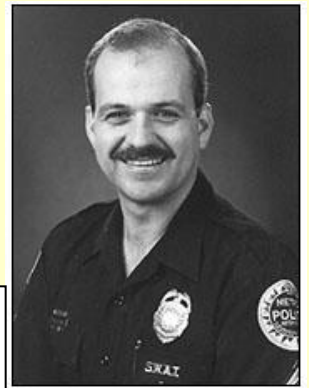

He served as Lieutenant to the Domestic Violence Division and was a member of the SWAT Team for fifteen years. Lt. Wynn was invited to the White House by President Clinton to deliver a speech on strategies to prevent domestic violence in the United States. Lt. Wynn is qualified as an "expert" on the issue of family violence in state and federal courts. Lt. Wynn has made national television appearances on The Oprah Winfrey Show, Bill Moyers - PBS, NBC World News Tonight, NBC's Dateline "Cries for Help," and others.
